

M'luruean Gandhian's book released by Japanese Princess

The Japanese edition of 'Gandhi's Outstanding Leadership' was released by Her Highness Princess Takamodo at the elegant Swami Vivekananda Indian Cultural Centre in Tokyo, last week. She did this draped in the Indian silk stole presented to her by Pascal Alan Nazareth .

In her remarks Princess Takamodo revealed that she had read the book and urged those in the audience to do so as it presents the various components of Gandhi's leadership and its global impact / contemporary pertinence by a widely travelled Indian ambassador in a perceptive / erudite manner .

Prime Minister Narendra Modi graciously sent a felicitatory Message for this release, see pictures.

The book, "GANDHI'S OUTSTANDING LEADERSHIP" authored by Bangalore based, well known retired Diplomat and Founder/ Managing Trustee of Sarvodaya International Trust, Pascal Alan Nazareth, is a distinguished personality of Karnataka. He hails from a Mangalorean family of well known nationalists, one of his sisters Mrs. Margaret Alva, was Governor of Uttarkhand and has been active in politics. Many books have been written and read on the Mahatma, our father of the nation, whose birth anniversary is marked on October 2.

The Author retired from Indian Foreign Service (IFS) after serving for 35 years in 1994. Among his postings are Ambassador in Egypt, Mexico, Liberia, Ghana; held other key diplomatic postings at Tokyo, Rangoon, New York, Lima, Chicago, and London, too. In 2007, author

P A Nazareth became a recipient of the prestigious 'U THANT PEACE AWARD' for his "life time of dedication and world service in promoting Gandhian ideals" - the previous recipients of this award are Mother Teresa, Pope John Paul-II, The Dalai Lama, Nelson Mandela and many other greats. This distinguished figure often referred to as 'Alan Nazareth' spends his retirement following in the footsteps of the Mahatma - literally. The prime component of the book is Gandhi's leadership elevated vision of humanity.

The Japanese edition was translated by Prof. Pema Gyalpo, a Japanese citizen of Tibetan origin who spend his early years in Darjeeling. He made this translation as a "labour of love" / his respectful tribute to Mahatma Gandhi and refused to accept even the modest US \$ 1000 honorarium which Sarvodaya International Trust (which has published the 5 English editions of this book) has been paying to its foreign language translators.

This edition has been published by Manyo Sha Publishing Company of Tokyo, which earlier has published books on Indian philosophy and those authored by His Holiness the Dalai Lama and Deepak Chopra

April 7 was the authors 82nd birthday. Japanese was his Indian Foreign Service language. The Japanese edition is the 20th foreign language edition of the book.

More Indian or more Christian?

Just like Indian Muslims, Christians in the country are also victims of a persistent questioning of their patriotism.

While suspicion of Christian groups has existed since the formation of the Indian state in 1947, this issue has gained in dimension with the election to power of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), which has support from Hindu groups working to make India a Hindu nation.

The BJP's electoral victory in 2014 has not only emboldened Hindu nationalist groups to dismiss as unpatriotic all actions and ideas that fail to conform to the aims of Hindu nationalist groups but has also led to increasing anti-Catholic violence, particularly in central India.

It seems this crisis facing Christians was very much on the mind of Cardinal Oswald Gracias when speaking at the conference of Latin rite bishops in Bangalore in February. He reportedly told the gathering: "The Catholic Church needs our nation, and India needs the church ... We will be asking our people also to become better Indian Christians. This is the call of today to be fully Indian, fully Christian."

In making such statements, bishops are making a profound analytical mistake not dissimilar to that made by the European Jews from the mid-18th century onwards.

Assuming that it was their external difference from Christian Europeans that was the reason for anti-Semitic hostility, sections of the Jews began to give up their distinctive dress, customs and sometimes religion to try and fit into the mainstream.

As the tragic consequences of World War II demonstrate, this did not stop them from being demonized across Europe and eventually meeting their end largely through the efforts of Nazi Germany. A similar mistake by the Catholic leadership in India could have serious consequences for Christians across the country.

The call to be "fully Indian, fully Christian" offers two suggestions. First, that Indian Christians are not as yet fully Indian, and secondly, that it is possible to identify what it means to be fully Indian and then meet those goals.

The first suggestion in fact plays directly into the hands of Hindu nationalists of all shades who suggest either explicitly or subtly that, given Christianity's foreign origins, Christians in India are not authentically Indian. That this claim is recognized by Christians themselves can be seen in a variety of cultural interventions that purport to be forms of inculturation.

Let us not forget that the attempt to become "Hindu-Christian" by some theologians is in fact identical to the requirement that Hindu groups place on Muslims and Christians in India — that they be Hindu-Muslims and Hindu-Christians, positing Hinduism (understood exclusively in its upper-caste Brahmanical forms) as the base culture of India.

The second suggestion requires more work. The recommendation that Catholics in India should be more Indian and more Christian seems to suggest that Indian-ness is capable of being objectively determined. This is not a sound appreciation of reality.

There is a mountain of scientific research that points to the fact that the unspoken ideal subject of Indian nationalism is the upper-caste (north) Indian Hindu male. Such research points out how even Jawaharlal Nehru's writings demonstrate an unconscious bias of Hindu-ness as the underlying theme of Indian-ness. It is these men, regardless of whether they are Hindu nationalists or secular Hindus, who define, and have been defining, what Indian-ness means.

Bluntly put, given that Christians in India are not in the position of defining what Indian-ness means, there is simply no way in which we will ever be able to approximate the ideals of

Indian-ness set by Indian nationalists of any hue.

What killed the Jews of Europe is similar to what threatens all non-Hindu communities in India today: the growth of nationalism.

The problem with most popular analyses of nationalism is that they do not recognize the difference between concepts of the nation and the state. The distinction between the two is perhaps best captured in Hannah Arendt's pithy observation of "the conquest of the state by the nation." In her view, nationalism transformed the modern state from an organ that would execute the rule of law for all its citizens and residents into the nation-state, an instrument of the nation alone.

Modern nationalism is inherently a divisive force, identifying religion, ethnicity or language as the basis of the nation, and in this process inevitably excluding groups within the state or creating hatred of those outside it.

Smaller social groups do not naturally exist as minorities; they are actively created or made minorities through conscious exclusion. That this exclusion is an inevitable aspect of nationalism is made obvious by the fact that the only way secular liberal nationalists across the world can think of the relationship with minority groups is that of tolerance. Not love but tolerance.

In many ways, nationalism is a theology that articulates a mystical relationship between the national-citizen and the nation constructed as a deity. It is when we recognize the theological nature of modern nationalism and the nation-state that perhaps we will become aware that there cannot be a compromise between nationalism and the Christian calling.

In this context, Archbishop Thomas Ignatius Macwan of Gandhinagar was right in the phrasing of the pastoral letter for which he was pilloried. Catholics have a religious obligation to ensure that nationalists do not take

over the state.

Fortunately, Catholics in India are not being asked to make a dramatic choice. The Christian call to universalism, one that recognizes neither Jew nor Gentile (Gal 3:28), can ensure that Christians are more than able to participate to the benefit of the state but refuse to cooperate in the sectarian projects of contemporary nationalism.

There is of course no need for Catholic leaders in India to actively proclaim a refusal to participate in nationalist projects; this would be a foolhardy venture in the current climate. But there is similarly no need for us to contribute to nationalist rhetoric by asking that we become more Indian.

Our call is to be more Christian, loving all without distinction.

Mining imbroglio in Goa

SC/ST type Act needed to protect our 'betis'

The horrific rape of an 8-yr old

girl in Kathua cannot be seen in isolation. Such incidents are growing with alarming regularity and impunity. Another equally gruesome incident has occurred in Surat, this time it's an 11-yr old girl. However most of these cases go unreported for fear of the high and mighty. Police officials are bribed. Victims and their families are threatened, even killed. Politicians remain silent and react with lip service, only when compelled to do so, following public rage.

The Kathua incident has exposed the hypocrisy of our leaders. What good are empty slogans like 'Beti bachao Beti padhao' or 'Sab ka saath Sab ka vikas'? The little girl from Kathua is Sab ka Beti and not the Beti of a Hindu, a Muslim or a Christian. We have become a depraved nation of hypocrites with hordes of gau rakshaks protecting animals while two-legged beasts roam free; with over zealous moral police protecting our Indian culture but not a single rakshaks to protect our betis.

Enough is enough. No more lip service or empty slogans. What we need is a strong Beti Bachao Act with similar provisions as the SC/ST Act such as: Externment of offenders, attachment and forfeiture of their properties; setting up of special courts and Special Public Prosecutors; enhanced punishments; denial of anticipatory bail; protection, compensation, relief and rehabilitation to victims or their heirs. Only then can we expect some protection for our Betis. Such is the fear among the victims today that even after the national outrage over the Kathua incident, the victim's family and kin have left the area as they fear for their lives.

While we hang our heads in shame, let church bells toll, let the national flag fly at half mast to mourn the murder and death of humanity.

Pope Francis has written a 'Preface' to an Italian language book of his writings and speeches, published on 12 April 2018, titled as noted above. He hopes his messages on economic and social matters will inspire those who exploit others to have a change of heart; thus coming to find a sense of humanity and justice! (some extracts):

“The Church, in spreading the message of charity and justice preached by the Gospel, cannot remain silent in the face of injustice and suffering ... Many encounters have confirmed to me, that the Gospel is not an utopia, but a real hope for the economy. God does not abandon his creatures; rather, He invites everyone in collaborating for the common good!”

“I cannot fail to denounce along with the Gospel, the personal and social sins committed against God and neighbor; in the name of the god of money and power. I believe that social and economic issues cannot be foreign to the message of the Gospel.”

“The economy occupies a vital place in the Church's 'social doctrine'! In this paradox of a globalised economy, there is an excess of money and wealth in the hands of a few people; but in others there is not even a minimum to survive!”

“Thus, it is practicable and so necessary in the field of economics and finance, that those in service of justice, solidarity and peace, should confirm 'the way of truth, charity and beauty'!” (cf. John 14:6).

WHETHER THE CONGRESS CAN WIN THE COMING NATIONAL ELECTION IN 2019?

Rahul Gandhi as expected has been elevated to be the Indian National Congress president. He seem to be learning on the job well, but the general consensus is that Narendra Modi and the BJP is not stoppable in the year 2019. Though many voters would like to see the back of Narendra Modi and the Hindutva hot heads in the RSS, they are greatly disturbed by the prospects of having the inexperienced Rahul Gandhi as the head of the government. Besides the Congress is faced with a very well oiled BJP party machine and during the last four years, the party has worked very hard to recruit more party workers. As a matter of fact, Amit Shah the BJP president has been boasting that BJP is now the worlds largest cadre party. All four young new general secretaries and chief Minister candidates must start recruiting at grass root levels, liberal minded youngsters to oversee the areas around each of the election booths. The old senior and experienced leaders should be promised cabinet berths if Congress wins the national general election in 2019. The next step will be to find young fresh leaders to head the Congress party as its general secretaries in states such as Gujarat, Haryana, Goa and Utterkund where Congress will mainly fight against BJP

Congressmen will not like this question. Why hasn't Rahul Gandhi unlike Narendra Modi, offered anything new in economic policy? They will see it as prejudiced or, at least, unfair. Yet if they open their eyes to how Mr. Rahul Gandhi is perceived, they will also realise this is an issue they need to grapple with and resolve before people vote in 18 months time. Otherwise many might desire a change of government, yet feel unable to vote for Congress. Now let me make a second point which could throw light on a possible answer to the above question. I'm not questioning Rahul Gandhi's right to be Congress President and his elevation may well change the party's fortunes. But does every Congress president have to automatically become prime minister? In Indira Gandhi's and Jawaharlal Nehru's time many did not. More pertinently, Sonia Gandhi brought Congress to power but refused to accept the prime min-

the assembly election that will be held this May. This is bound to pay dividends as he has the pulse of the Kannadiga people and is putting together a coalition of Schedule castes, OBCs, Muslim, Christians along with the liberals and agriculturists. A little more organisational support at grass root and booth levels by the Congress party workers, to counter the well oiled RSS and BJP cadres, will do the job of giving Siddharamiah the second term and Congress the badly needed win.

What about the other states like Rajasthan and Madhya Pradesh that will be going for elections later in the year. Luckily for Rahul Gandhi, he has two bright, young but experienced leaders like Sachin Pilot in Rajasthan and Jyotindar Scindia in Madhya Pradesh. Without wasting any time Rahul Gandhi soon after the Karnataka elections should name the above two dynamic young leaders as heads of Congress party in the respective states. Let them be officially named as the General Secretaries and the official chief Minister candidate of the Congress

stership. The common man greatly respected her for doing so.

Could a repeat of the Sonia Gandhi-Manmohan Singh arrangement which worked successfully, announced well before the elections, remove the hesitation in the minds of those who want a change but are apprehensive of voting for Congress? I accept it's difficult to name the individual who will play the Manmohan Singh role, but there's a need to do so at some stage before the election. If Rahul Gandhi takes the trouble of finding someone like say Raghuram Rajan or Nandan Nilekani to be named as the Prime Minister candidate, it will make a huge difference during elections. Of course, this won't be an easy decision for Rahul Gandhi. He's been brought up to believe he will be the prime minister and the fourth generation of his family to hold that post. To disavow it won't be easy. But it would be a sign of greatness. For he would be putting party and country ahead of himself. Indeed, it would be an even bigger sacrifice than the one his mother made in 2004. Her Italian origin made her refusal not just understandable but, perhaps, necessary. Rahul Gandhi, on the other hand, is as Indian as you and I.

Rahul Gandhi's biggest challenge is rebuilding the Indian National Congress party organisation. One other thing: an announcement by Rahul Gandhi that he won't be prime minister could cast an emotional spell. To fight and win but not want the laurels of office is the sort of humility that reflects our cultural values. It could even alter the way Narendra Modi is perceived because thereafter, in contrast, his ambition might seem like greed. If I'm right, the question I've raised and the answer I've suggested could become more pressing with each passing month. But it's also possible that I'm wrong and the way we view Rahul Gandhi might change so comprehensively that our apprehensions will simply fade away before 2019. You the Citizens decide what will be good for the Congress party?

But media gets the story in a politically favored direction and without checking facts and to create headlines and high ratings for their respective newspapers/channels rush to publish the same which is quickly picked up by others and widely circulated resulting in wrong/fake news and with no file closure and the government response - #Nobody Knows Anything. We the people of India want to know -

Is this the government we elected or nobody knows who elected this government.

We have to answer a more preliminary question first: What is truth? And how do we know?

It's a question that can have life-or-death consequences. Fake news has become a white-hot political and, really, cultural topic, but the trigger personal events.

Here's the thing: Fake news dominates according to both metrics. It consistently reaches a larger audience, and it tunnels much deeper into social networks than real news does.

Why does falsehood do so well? The MIT team settled on two hypotheses.

First, fake news seems to be more "novel" than real news. Falsehoods are often notably different from the all the news that have appeared 60 days prior to their retesting them.

Second, fake news evokes much more emotion than the average news/tweet.

Fake news/tweets tended to elicit words associated with surprise and disgust, while accurate news/tweets summoned words associated with sadness and trust.

The key takeaway is really that content that arouses strong emotions spreads further, faster, more deeply, and more broadly. False information online is often really novel and frequently negative. We know those are two features of information generally that grab our attention as human beings and that cause us to want to share that information with others—we're attentive to novel threats and especially attentive to negative threats.

The question is why the world citizenry is standing silent. To quote Einstein - "The world will not be destroyed by those who do evil, but by those who watch them without doing anything."

others and their attitudes but barely spend time to change themselves and their own attitudes. Personal transformation anyone? Change is difficult Yes! and often unacceptable. Meditations On The Priesthood Bring Blessings

We cannot escape the fact that God wants us to witness our faith through His Son Jesus, who “holds his priesthood permanently, because he continues forever”. Spiritual Meditations on the priesthood is the ultimate blessing for the new evangelization, to teach, preach and bring people to faith.

The Priest is the light, salt and leaven. But he is also human. When the Cure of Ars spoke, his voice was weak and many could not hear him, yet they flocked in thousands to his church. It is said, a gentleman who attended a Sunday Mass was visibly changed and said, “I have seen God in a human”.

It takes humility to brave the odds and stand up for God. A priest makes the time to meditate on his ‘royal’ priesthood. St. Paul said, “We are the temple of the living God. “ (2Cor.6:16). Yes, we all are, for the breath of the Almighty lives in us. The priest is an exception for he is the ‘anointed one’ and shepherd of the faith.

St. Peter, the first leader of the Christian faith, had shared a special divine perspective on the priesthood: “You are a chosen race, a royal priesthood... a holy nation, God’s own people...” (1 Peter.2:9). This is the First most powerful message to meditate on.

Meditation in common understanding is to be found in the beginning of Mark’s Gospel: Here begins the wonderful story of Jesus the Messiah, the Son of God. (Mk.1:1). The apostle wants us to think on the roots of the faith. The legacy of Christian identity as bound to the Church and her priests who proclaim it and teach

the good news; the kingdom of God and Eternal life.

The spiritual powers of the priest, to be outwardly recognized, will be to meditate

on the words of James Gibbons: The Faith of Our Fathers, 1876. I quote: “To the carnal eye the priest looks like other men, but to the eye of faith he is exalted above the angels, because he exercises powers not given even to angels”. The priest better knows the essentials of Jesus’ exhortation to believe and repent. The priest is a messenger with the subtle message to evangelize, equally to be a good listener.

In our present times of hate, violence and irresponsible rage towards Christians worldwide, we need to meditate on the steadfast courage of priests who enrich their vocation to reveal their journey in humility as Christ did, often unto death.

One such priest was Fr. Andrea Santoro, praised for his dedication and devotion to serve the Lord. He travelled to Turkey in Trabzon, a small city of 200,000 people. 99% Muslims lived in the city and only a few Christian people among them. There were almost a hundred mosques and only one Catholic Church.

Fr. Andrea worked with the poor, the hungry and rescued women who were trafficked for the flesh trade. He made a great impact on hundreds of lives for his kindness and assistance. He was blest with many spiritual gifts and became a clerical hero; a priest who was totally committed to helping all, Christians and even Muslims.

Tragically, on February 5, 2006, while praying in his church, a man walked in and shot Fr. Andrea twice from behind. A week before his death, Fr. Andrea spoke to a meeting of the clergy. Let us meditate on his words: “I am convinced that in the end there are no two ways, only one way that leads

to light through darkness, to life through the bitterness of death. Only by offering one’s flesh is salvation possible. The evil that stalks the world must be borne and pain must be shared till the end in one’s own flesh as Jesus did.”

The diocese of Rome is promoting the cause of his canonization.

All priests have basically a lifestyle of dedication which makes them valuable in the Church. Their charisma is an authentic witness to the Gospel. Every priest believes he is an anchor for the preservation of the faith, its strength for solidarity, peace and justice.

The priest cannot be taken for granted as being altruistic by nature because he serves others, or that he is given a ministerial job. The priest always strives to help all those put in his care, “to be a manifestation and image of the Good Shepherd who gives his life”. (PDV, No.49). His identity is made strong in pastoral service.

To have a broad perspective on the formation of priestly ministry is to absorb, like Christ, a complete dedication to humanity for the love of the Father’s will.

Aspire to serve God and His Church in humility. I reproduce a small section from the homily of Pope Saint John Paul II for the canonization of Padre Pio, June 26, 2002:

‘I believe you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because these things.... you have revealed to little ones’ (Mt.11:25). How appropriate are these words of Jesus, when we think of them as applied to you, humble and beloved Padre Pio....”

Let us meditate on the holy life of Saint Padre Pio.

Indian Dance Art To The Fore!


South Indian culture

Admittedly, Bharatanatyam is essentially a South Indian art form of dance. Frankly, one simply fails to see any reason why the Bharatanatyam exponent, Vidwat Ruth Prithika, who delivered a 2-hour performance in the Town Hall of Mangaluru on Easter Sunday 2018, can't be brought to Mumbai for a repeat performance of the Mangaluru event, **preceded of course by adequate** publicity. There definitely would be a market for such Scripture-based Indian Classical Dance performances in multi-cultural Mumbai. Indeed, doesn't the city of Mumbai and the Archdiocese of Bombay have a sizeable population from the South settled in huge pockets? Not many years ago this writer had the privilege and pleasure of directing a Bharatanatyam exponent [Mangalurean, Catholic] from Bandra West in a well received presentation of the Conver-

sion of Saint Paul at a convent book-fest.

Unseemly dance culture

It isn't difficult to see—if one reads between the lines so to say!—that all those silly so-called Western dance (including the vulgar pelvic thrust) moves immortalized by Bollywood and imitated with aplomb by children and youth in almost all educational institutions in Mumbai



(not to speak of youngsters under formation in religious houses!), are no match for the genuine stuff that most Indian dance forms, both classical and folk have on offer. **Catholic institutions particularly have it in them to boldly stem the rot and turn the tide.**

If Christians in India in general and Catholics in our cities in particular can carry off the Indian sari, kurta and other Indian garb with distinction, giving Indian dance forms, whose mainstay is essentially Indian costumes, their due in terms of conveying the beauty of our scriptures to fellow believers and non-believers alike can hardly be a hassle. What is urgently needed is a will on the part of the management of every Catholic institution to put its foot down and

It certainly is not difficult to discern that a tasteful blend of Indian and Western culture with regard to song/music, dance and costume can go a long way in both entertaining any given audience as well as conveying a moral or a message. Again, this was amply proved with the fusion presentation of the Hindi song "Man ka deep jala" by a nun and a laywoman, both Bharatanatyam danseuses, at a convent media related symposium on women a couple of years ago, delightful movements and facial expressions dominating the scene.

All in all, we need to tastefully change the face of Christian entertainment and thus change the way non-Christians perceive our understanding of Indian culture vis-à-vis the Faith of our Fathers. Ready for the plunge!?!

Historic Aloysius Chapel art being restored

The world famous historic chapel art in the heart of St. Aloysius College Mangaluru on Lighthouse Hill, is a protected monument which is a permanent attraction for visitors all year round. More than two decades after experts from Indian National Trust for Art and Cultural Heritage (INTACH) of Lucknow restored the world famous paintings by Italian Jesuit master painter Br Antonio Moscheni (created in 1899), another team from INTACH, Delhi, is all set to restore the same with advanced scientific know how and technology.

St Aloysius Institutions Rector Rev Fr Dionysius Vas said that St Aloysius had contacted INTACH, as the head of the previous team (that restored the paintings between 1991 to 1994) had suggested that the paintings be renovated every 20 years.

Accordingly, the prestigious national institute visited the chapel and INTACH Principal Director Nilabh Sinha submitted a detailed report in March 2017. The work on restoration commenced in November 2017 and is expected to be completed within 18 months (May 2019).

Giving details on the same, Nilabh Sinha said that during his visit in March 2016, he found that although the paintings are in good condition, signs of deterioration have set in and it was just the right time to redo the process of conservation to prolong the life of the rare paintings.

Noting that most of such damages are only up to seven feet (due to touching of visitors), Sinha said, "The factors of deterioration of an art form could be in the form of high-temperature, relative humidity, dust, pollution,



light and several other climatic and human factors, which triggers chemical reactions leading to deterioration and decay of art forms."

"A successful conservation treatment is based on scientific analysis of the materials involved in making of an art form, studying the pattern of deterioration, studying the extent of problems in the art forms and then coming up with a safe treatment procedure, which not only retards the phenomenon of deterioration, but also prolongs the life of an artefact," he informed.



He also said that the new damages that have occurred in paintings are being treated properly and protection to paintings are being given, so that the conservation treatment shall increase the life of these 120-year old paintings, by another 25 years.

Stating that expert conservators from Delhi have been deputed for undertaking the work, Sinha said that he is also looking for local artistes, who will be taught the art of conservation by experts.

Terming the paintings as a national and international treasure, internationally acclaimed scientist and former Rector Rev Fr Leo D'Souza said that the project is taken up at a cost of Rs 1.5 crore and the entire expenses are borne by Jesuit Institutions, with the help from philanthropists. He also said that an Italian painter, who visited the chapel recently, expressed his satisfaction about the restoration work. Inciden-

tally, he also happens to be the husband of great grand niece of Br Antonio Moscheni.

Terming the paintings as rarest and hardly found anywhere in India, INTACH Principal Director Nilabh Sinha said that it is extremely difficult to create Fresco painting, as the artist needs to imagine what he is going to create in a day and complete the imagination before it dries.

Recap on the paintings :

Born in a village Stezzano near Bergamo, in Italy, on January 17, 1854, Antonio Moscheni studied under able masters and later went to Rome to study masterpieces of Vatican. In 1889, he renounced the prospects of a brilliant career, but he turned religious in Society of Jesus. His superiors asked him to paint several churches in his native and also in Albania and Yugoslavia.

They sent him to Mangaluru to paint the chapel of St Aloysius College. It took him little over two years to cover every inch of the walls and ceilings of the chapel with Frescos and oil paintings, depicting the life of Jesus and St Aloysius Gonzaga in 1899. Later, he painted Cathedral in Mumbai and a church in Cochin, all single handedly.

The central row of paintings on the ceiling depicts the life of Saint Aloysius Gonzaga, to whom the college and chapel are dedicated. Aloysius earlier life is shown in the first three panels from the rear. The central picture depicts him serving the plague stricken in Rome. He contracted the disease and died, at the age of 23.

The sloping ceiling panels portray the Apostles, with floral garlands weaving through the panels. No two garlands have the same flowers. The angels who hold the garland are life size. The upper arches depict saints of the Church. The lower arches depict Jesuit saints.

The painting on the rear wall shows Jesus as the friend of children. It is considered to be the masterpiece of Moscheni. Due to seepage of rain water the painting was covered with fungus and calcium carbonate crystals. It has now been restored but a patch of the unrestored painting has been left untouched below the woman seated at the right. There are many paintings which take up the life of Jesus.

There are two types of paintings in the chapel: fresco and canvas. A fresco is painted on fresh wet lime plaster walls. The colours get embedded in the lime plaster as it dries up. Frescos cover about 600 square metres of the walls of the Chapel. For an oil painting, the colours are made by mixing pigments with linseed oil. The canvas is made of pure linen of strong close weave. The paintings on the ceilings in the Chapel (about 400 square metres) are in oil on canvas.


She Is My Mother – Pope Francis' Encounters With Mary

The new kind of Pastor the Church Universal got itself on 13 March 2013 has amazed, surprised and enthralled the world like no Pope before him ever has! His impromptu comments as much as his reflections and homilies are eagerly awaited and delightfully devoured as much for their content as for the topics or subjects covered. And if there is one subject that his pronouncements frequently touch upon it is Mary. And why not! Pope Francis' love for 'Mama' (Spanish for mother) Mary is phenomenal and probably second only to Jesus' love for her. If in Jesus Francis feels called to a personal relationship with God, in Mary he encounters a woman whose faith is so intertwined with her motherhood that he feels adequately protected, comforted, nourished and cared for. That in a nutshell is SHE IS MY MOTHER – POPE FRANCIS' ENCOUNTERS WITH MARY [St Pauls – ISBN 978-93-5015-302-4 / pp 256 / INR 250] for you!

The contents of the book are culled from a series of interviews between Pope Francis and the author who was his secretary during World Youth Day 2013 in Rio de Janeiro. The Lord himself says, "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of Heaven" (Mt 18:3). What comes through in Pope Francis' candid sharing of his experiences concerning Our

Lady, starting with his childhood and up until his stint as Bishop of Rome and Chief Shepherd of the Universal Church is his childlike simplicity, which, in itself constitutes a source of Christian catechesis—catechesis that brings alive the value of Marian sanc-

tuaries and popular piety, besides highlighting the place of woman in the Church and throwing much light on several other topics relevant for our times.

Pope Francis' encounters with the Virgin Mother of Jesus include titles little known in this part of Christendom, like 'Our Lady of Aparecida' (a term that means 'appeared') in Brazil. The 18th century 'apparition' of our Blessed Mother in a net cast by three fishermen in a river involved a headless statue of the Immaculate Conception first and then the head itself in a second catch, followed by a huge catch of fish that had been eluding the fishermen for a while until then. Pope Francis' interpretation of the net-find makes for inspiring reading, speaking as he does of the happening being implicit of God's intention to reunite with man's help what was separated, divided. Read about it all in Chapter 7 (pp 135-160), thus allowing for the uplift of your soul along Marian lines!

A notable feature of this book is what Chapter 10 [pp 245-254] brings the reader—the pope's favourite Marian prayers and devotions, even as it highlights their importance in the life of the Church as a whole and of the individual believer. It is often said that the Holy Bible is a peep into the heart of God, a loving Father. SHE IS MY MOTHER – POPE FRANCIS' ENCOUNTERS WITH MARY could well be considered a peep into the Marian heart of Pope Francis who represents but the Son's First Vicar on earth! And what does one see in there but an invitation to avail of and forever cherish the love of God as spelt out for us in the heart of His Mother, Mary, Schoenstatt priest, Alexandre Awi Mello clearing the path for us with his path-breaking interview with His Holiness! Indeed, a more delightfully simple Theology-packed treatise on Mary would be hard to come by!

The publishers deserve to be complimented for bringing this book out in time for the month of May, the Rosarian month of Mary that willy-nilly overlaps the month of the Holy Spirit!

Switch from a to-do list to a SUCCESS list

To-do lists are a staple of modern life. There's just one problem: your to-do list can be damaging your goals! Are you wondering, 'How'? Well, long hours spent checking off a to-do list and ending the day with a full trash can and a clean desk are not virtuous and have nothing to do with success. Decide on a list system: You can keep your list on a simple piece of paper but researchers have found it to be far more effective if you use a written or digital system, either on a notebook or in a program such as Evernote.

Set three 'micro-goals' for today: Block out a section at the top of your page for three micro-goals. If you need to write or type this section in red to priorities it above the rest of the information below, do that. These are small things you can do today that will help you make progress towards your long-term goals.

Examples include: writing 'X' amount of words, making a phone call, working out for 'X' minutes or completing some other important task. These are often the primary, repeatable tasks that have to do with your craft.

3. Garlic: This flavoured vegetable is appealing to human beings, but lizards hate the smell of it. Just hang a few cloves of garlic near the doors and windows to keep away the pests. You can also make a spray using garlic juice and water and spray it around the house.

Pepper Spray: Pepper sprays aren't just for creeps – you can shock the lizards with these homemade sprays. What's more is that these are homemade and easy to make – no harmful chemicals at all! 


