
Indians, this definition seems to be true no longer!

Sister Enedina, 86, of the 'Daughters of Charity' who rendered yeoman service for 54 years to the locals in the backward areas of Odisha was

denied a renewal of Visa and was ordered to 'leave the country within 10 days'!( reportedly she left India and flew to Spain on august 20) How did she, a religious sister from Spain become a 'Mother' to the poor people living in the unknown hamlets in India?

Sr. Enadina, came to India to spread

the kingdom of God, of peace, joy and contentment! Her commitment to this cause brought her in contact with the sick and deprived people of Aliganda village and surrounding areas. She worked relentlessly with other volunteers to minister to the local poor who had no access to education and healthcare. With her valuable humanitarian work as a doc-



Her life-story as reported in the media, defines a selfless soul, easily moved

by pain and suffering. Sister Enedina earned bachelor's degrees in medicine and surgery from Madrid Capital Medical College in 1959. After arriving in Berhampur several years later, she opened a dispensary to cater to the healthcare needs of local people mostly tribal and socially poor Dalit people. Five years later, she moved to Mohana village in nearby Gajapati district and began working to educate the locals. Apart from establishing a dispensary, Enedina also set up a high school in 1996 and a primary school in 2009. A hostel that was constructed by her, provided food and lodging to students who came from distant areas to study at the schools. Mahima Nayak, a student who stays in a hostel set up by the sister, told the media that Sr.Enedima provided them with food and house. "She even helped children of the area to get education."

ucanews.com reported that the sister had renewed her visa periodically since she arrived in Behrampur in 1965, but the government rejected her application this time around. India's Ministry of External Affairs deals with visa issues but maintains a policy of not stating any reason when a visa is denied.

"She (Enedina) used to say that serving the poor and destitute is to serve God. We are very sad as she is going to leave us. She used to take care of the residents of this area like her children," said Swarnalata Pradhan, a sister who worked with her. The locals demanded that the government must do something for Enedina so that she can stay in Aliganda for longer period and continue her noble work.

What motivates people like Saint Mother Theresa and Sr. Enadina to uproot themselves, give up a comfortable lifestyle to embrace the sick and the poor in a distant unknown country?

# Calangute Village Panchayat bans drinking on the beach

The Calangute Village Panchayat

has issued a notice banning consumption of alcohol on the beach, roads and public places in its jurisdiction. Individuals who violate the ban will be fined Rs 2,000 while the fine for groups will be Rs 10, 000. Earlier, the state govt too had banned drinking on beaches and public places, but to little effect. ## Nun protest has terrorist links, claim Indian bishops

Kochi: The synod of an Eastern-rite Church in India claims that people linked with terrorists and anti-church groups are among those masquerading as protectors of a Catholic nun dismissed by her congregation.

The bishops in the Syro-Malabar Church in the southwestern state of Kerala said on Aug. 27 that Sister Lucy Kalapura's dismissal by the Franciscan Clarist Congregation (FCC) in early August followed all canonical norms and was done with the Vatican's approval.

"It is deplorable that external forces are exerting pressure tactics in the internal affairs of a religious congregation," said a statement from the 11-day synod, which concluded on Aug. 30

The synod, attended by 57 of the Church's 63 bishops, was referring to the ongoing protests and social media debates by rights groups and some Catholics that the FCC had violated the 54-year-old nun's rights when dismissing her.

"Anti-social elements, anti-church groups and groups linked with terror organizations" have joined together against the Church "masquerading as protectors of religious life," the synod statement said.

It referred specifically to an Aug.

28 demonstration that some rights groups organized in front of an FCC provincial house in the rural district of Wayanad.

Sister Kalapura continues to live in her convent there pending a verdict in an appeal she filed with the Vatican against her dismissal.

The synod asked Catholics to desist from joining the protest, organized by Save Our Sisters, an interfaith forum that helps women in distress, saying it had been organized by different terrorist groups.

The synod also expressed concern over protests being organized against Christians, which they said threatened interreligious amity in the state.

Church officials told ucanews.com that they're not making baseless allegations.

"These protestors are supported by some Maoist groups, who are under police watch. We have proof of them accusing and threatening the Church," said Father Noble Mathew Parackal, the public relations officer Manathavady Diocese based in Wayanad.

Synod has 'no authority' over SOS

An official of Save Our Sisters told ucanews.com that it had sought legal

advice after the synod linked them with terrorist groups.

"These are serious allegations that will have far-reaching ramifications, especially when it comes from a responsible church body. It's imperative that we legally challenge it," said Shaiju Antony, an SOS joint convener.

He said SOS was not a church group and the synod had no authority over its members.

Antony said it had organized the protest to bring the attention of the world to Sister Kalapura's basic rights. "You can't just throw out a nun who has lived in a convent for 30 years in the name of disobedience," he said.

Sister Kalapura says she was sacked on Aug. 5 for supporting last September's public protests by some nuns against Bishop Franco Mulakkal of Jalandhar, who is accused of rape.

But the FCC says its records show that Sister Kalapura had been defiantly violating the rules of the congregation for at least five years and had ignored canonical warnings to mend her ways.

Moreover, it said she had violated her vows of poverty and obedience by spending her salary on unwarranted expenses, including buying a car against the orders of her superiors.

She continues to teach in a government-aided school.

Antony said her case was closely linked with that of the bishop accused of rape. "Some bishops in the hierarchy are bent on taking action against all those who protested" against Bishop Franco, he said.

"But it is a mindless move to bracket people as terrorists just because we stand up to question wrongdoings."



# Remembering the disappeared

Manila: The world is supposed to mark Aug. 30 as the International Day of Victims of Enforced Disappearances.

In a world where the sanctity of life is supposedly respected, some 57,891 people, according to the United Nations, have fallen victims of enforced disappearances since 1980.

With an estimated 60,000 cases occurring in Sri Lanka alone, the U.N. figures obviously reflect under-reporting.

A life lost due to enforced disappearance is worse enough, and the devastation it causes to the family is irreparable.

Asia is the region that has submitted the highest number of enforced disappearance cases to the U.N. in the past two decades.

The Philippines has the highest number of cases submitted from Southeast Asia. The Permanent Mission of the Philippines to the U.N. in Geneva has sought the de-listing of 625 cases that mostly occurred during the years of the Marcos dictatorship in the 1970s and the early 1980s.

Families of the disappeared all over the world have already united and formed themselves into associations to amplify their collective voices.

Their persistence has moved the U.N. to adopt an international treaty on enforced disappearances that provides, among others, the right to truth and the right not to be subjected to them.

The Philippines, which supposedly has an anti-enforced disappearance law and whose many provisions are compatible with the treaty, refuses to be a party to it.

Every year, the stories of those who have gone missing continue to be shared.

Maria Adela Antokoletz of the Madres de Plaza de Mayo-Linea Fundadora in Argentina still recalls the disappearance of his brother Daniel more than 40 years ago.

"I vividly remember my only brother, Daniel, a desaparecido. I want him to be at my side so I can embrace him and tell him stories," she said.

"My memory goes vertically straight to my heart and horizontally, too, to embrace those who are definitely part of my life," added Adela.

Amina Masood, wife of disappeared Masood Ahmed Janjua, said the annual observance has become an occasion "when I can put pressure on the power corridors and tell them in a screaming way that I do not accept the disappearance of my loving husband."

"I am knocking at the world's conscience that no matter what, I can die but cannot give up hope to find him," said Amina, whose husband was disappeared in Pakistan on July 30, 2005.

Life cycle starts with birth, followed with infancy, childhood, adulthood, old age, and death. But in cases of enforced disappearances, regardless of the victim's age, the cycle is disrupted.

There is a huge possibility of death, but without proof and with the absence of closure, it has become so cruel, so inhuman, and un-Christian.

The states' inhumanity is manifested, among many different ways, in using such a tool to terrorize not only the victims' families but also society.

Historically an instrument of military dictatorships, enforced disappearance is perpetrated in internal conflicts, struggle for independence, war on terror, war on drugs, and in some situations, committed in the context of migration.

This is a potent form of harassment against victims, human rights defenders, and organizations.

During Pope Francis' visit to the Philippines in 2015, he gave a special prayer to the disappeared, a reality that also exists in his beloved Argentina.

The best and the brightest in the pope's homeland were made to disappear at the height of the military dictatorship in the 1970s.

In the Philippines, the administration of President Rodrigo Duterte has gained notoriety in recent months after several states voted for a U.N. resolution that aims to investigate the wave of killings and other human rights violations in the country.

The government dismissed the allegations as an infringement on the country's sovereignty.

Its 3-year-old war on drugs, however, resulted in nameless, undocumented desaparecidos who are added to the litany of names that the government proposed to de-list from the U.N.

The best tribute the world can pay to the disappeared today is to struggle for the non-repetition of enforced disappearances.

# World Forgiveness Day

## Modernise the Mumbai Metro

The Mumbai Metro must be modernised by ensuring that all train compartments have water sprinklers on their roofs in addition to fire extinguishers to help extinguish fires and deal with short circuits and all train carriages must be painted on the interior and exterior with a non stainable paint and streamlined metro trains must be constructed out of aluminium with an inner steel body

The elevated metro rails must have strong pumps to pump out water during the monsoons and prevent them from getting flooded and depending on the space available the elevated metro must be extended by building four parallel lines on either side or four railway flyover lines on top of each other.

# **Mother of the Poorest**

(Mother Teresa)

Tho has not heard of Mother Teresa? Her nuns are seen in every Indian town and abroad. She has become an icon of charity and selfless service. But would she have become so famous if she did not respond to her inner voice on that day?

Agnes Gonxhe Bojaxha, who was known later as Mother Teresa, was born on Aug 26, 1910 in Skopje, now the capital of North Macedonia. She was the youngest child of Nikola and Dranafile Bojaxha. Her father, who was a construction contractor, a trader and worked for Albanian Independence, died when she was only eight years old. With great difficulties her simple, religious and altruistic mother brought up her two daughters.

As a school girl, Agnes was fascinated by the stories of the missionaries in Bengal. Wishing to become a religious nun, at the age of 18 she joined the Sisters of Loreto in Rathfarnham, Ireland. She was sent to India in 1929 and began her novitiate in Darjeeling. She took her first religious vows on May 24, 1931 and chose the name Teresa, after St Therese of Lisieux, the patron saint of missionaries.

While she served as a teacher at their St. Mary's school, Entally, eastern Calcutta, Teresa took her solemn vows on May 14, 1937. She was appointed its headmistress in 1944 and taught here for twenty years. Though she enjoyed teaching and loved her students coming from affluent families, she was disturbed by the sight of poverty around Calcutta. The Bengal famine of 1943 and the Hindu Muslim violence in 1946 brought misery to the poor.

While she travelled by train for her annual retreat to Darjeeling on Sept 10, 1946, she experienced "the call within the call" to serve the poorest of the poor. With permission of the Church

authorities, she left the Loreto convent in 1948 to live with and serve God in the poorest. She changed her western Loreto dress for the simple, white cotton Indian sari with blue border.

Taking Indian citizenship, she spent several months in Holy Family Hospital, Patna, to receive basic medical training. She began teaching the unschooled kids in Calcutta's Motijhil slum and tended the poor. But with no financial income and support from anybody, she experienced doubt, loneliness and the tempter enticed her to return to her comfortable convent life. She experienced "the darkness of her soul." That however made her realize the poverty of the poor and to surrender herself to God's will.

Attracted by her good works some of her former students began to join her. On Oct 7, 1950, she received the permission from the Vatican to start her diocesan congregation, the Missionaries of Charity (M. C.), to serve "the unwanted, the unloved, and the uncared for." With help from Calcutta government officials, in 1952 Teresa opened her first Home for the Dying at the abandoned Kalighat temple, renaming it as Nirmal Hriday (Home for the Pure Heart), for people "who lived like animals to die like angels loved and wanted." She opened then a hospice for those with leprosy, calling it Shanti Nagar (City of Peace). In 1955 she opened the Nirmal Shishu Bhavan, a home for the orphaned children.

Her humanitarian works among the destitute began to attract funds and vocations. In the 1960s she opened many hospices, orphanages and houses for the destitute, leprosy, TB and AIDS patients throughout India. In the 1970's she became a global celebrity and her congregation became international.

To expand her charity to every section of the people and to get the cooperation of all, M. Teresa founded The Missionaries of Charity Brothers in 1963.

a contemplative branch of the Sisters in 1976 and Contemplative Branch of Brothers in 1979. Lay Catholics and non-Catholics were enrolled as Lay Missionaries of Charity. In 1981 she founded the Corpus Christi Movement for priests and the Missionaries of Charity Fathers in 1984.

The Indian government honoured her in 1962 with Padma Shri and in 1980 with the highest civilian award - the Bharat Ratna. Some of the important international recognitions were: Nobel Peace Prize in 1979, Ramon Magsaysay Award in 1962, and the U.S. Presidential Medal of Freedom in 1985. The first Pope John XXIII Peace Prize was awarded to her by the Catholic Church in 1979.

M. Teresa suffered a heart attack in 1983, a second attack in 1989 and in 1991 a bout of pneumonia. In 1996 she fell and broke her collarbone, then was affected by heart failure. She resigned on March 13, 1997 as head of the M. C and she died on Sept 5, 1997. At the time of her death the M.C. sisters numbered over 4000 nuns, 300 brothers and more than one lakh co-workers, serving the destitute in 610 places in 123 countries.

Though people regarded her as a saint while alive, Pope John Paul II beatified her on Oct 19, 2003 and Pope Francis canonised her on Sept 4, 2016 in Vatican. She was declared a co-patron of the Calcutta archdiocese at the first anniversary of her canonization. In 2017 the first Kosovo Roman Catholic cathedral was named after her.

Pope Francis remarked of her at the canonization, "Mother Teresa, in all aspects of her life, was a generous dispenser of divine mercy, making herself available for everyone through her welcome and defense of human life, those unborn and those abandoned and discarded."

#### The 'Go-to' Man Goes!

Though Arun Jaitley has been ailing for quite some time, nobody really expected the end to come so soon. No doubt, he has been suffering a lot and that is the reason why he opted out of Modi:2 dispensation and the PM was gracious enough to respect the wishes of the ailing aide. He was a go-to man for his party. The PM would have surely wanted him to head the Finance Ministry to put the economy back on the rails. Perhaps things may not have looked so gloomy under his care.

All of us agree that Jaitley was the corner-stone of the Modi:1 government. He was to BJP what Pranab Mukherji was to the UPA. Yet, Jaitley with his amiable nature got along with every politician in the opposition camp who saw him as a moderating force in the NDA. He defended the government fiercely when it was most needed but remained away from hard line approach. He believed in genuine secularism but came down heavily on those indulging in pseudo-secularism. He remained focused on whatever role he was asked to play and did not let down those who trusted him to deliver.

A Supreme Court Lawyer of repute who argued important cases and came out successful with his highly skilled line of reasoning in the Court. With Modi winning the elections in 2014, Jaitley, who lost the contest himself, gave up his legal practice to be part of the government. Though he himself aspired for the PM's post at one stage he quickly adjusted his sails to align with Narendra Modi to become his virtual number 2 in the cabinet and remained in that position till his health starting failing him rapidly. His administrative skills and his authority on constitutional issues earned him the respect and admiration of his detractors as well.

Only a couple of weeks earlier, the BJP lost another stalwart in Sushma Swaraj who was also suffering from similar ailment. Two huge losses in quick succession made the BJP weaker to some extent on the administrative side and you can see the PM struggling to find the right talent to take the country to a 5 trillion economy. With the state of the economy in a state of virtual

coma, the Prime Minister has a daunting task ahead. It is just as well that the opposition is fragmented and weak. Otherwise the government could have been put on the mat and embarrassed. While the government is trying its best, it is doubtful if things could look better to herald the "acche din" which has been eluding the nation for the last five years. No wonder there is a demand through the social media to give us back those "bure din" which, on hind sight, looked much better.

The loss of the two big leaders has weakened the administrative quotient of the Modi:2 government though it is putting up a brave face and even resorting to lateral recruitments in the government to face the many challenges. Faced with criticism, the government may be diverting public attention and targeting opposition leaders for perceived corrupt cases. Ironically, not a single tainted BJP or NDA politician is in the line of firing which reinforces the belief that the drive is selective. With a weak opposition and with many of their leaders literally making a beeline to join the BJP, even today, it is doubtful if the government could be brought to its knees for the dismal performance. Though the passing away of Arun Jaitely and Sushma Swaraj is a colossal loss, the government is well entrenched. The likes of Pragya Singh Thakur may blame the opposition for their death. Though the party has distanced itself from her allegations it will do well to distance itself from such motor-mouths otherwise it will give credence to general perception that the party is archaic in its mental set-up.

## Maharashtra politics

With the assembly elections just a couple of months away, there is intense competition between the BJP and the Shiv Sena with the latter vying for the top post. The incumbent CM cleverly welcomed the Sena cub to be a part of his cabinet ostensibly to be under him [at best a Dy CM]. All said and done, if the Sena gets more seats than the BJP there is no reason why the top post should go to the BJP. Things will crystallize in the coming days. At this point in time, the saffron combine is in a driver's seat and should be able to return to

power with ease. The only suspense would be the opposition tally. The forthcoming election contest will be akin to India-West Indies series – one sided affair.

There is no opposition in the State. The Congress is a rudderless ship with no real agenda. There is no clear cut direction and it is said when you know not where to go, any road will take you there. With this state of affairs there is confusion across the party and the cadre lacks discipline which is replaced by in-fighting. Those who are not fighting are deserting the party for greener pastures. Maharashtra is no exception with rumours floating about the erstwhile State President returning to his parent party, his denial notwithstanding. The position in the NCP is worse, with the party with party leaders joining the winning side – BJP and Sena in this case. Sharad Pawar is powerless and a lonely man with Ajit Pawar waiting to grab the party leadership but he himself is under a scanner in the irrigation scam. Others like the VBA of Prakash Ambedkar and AIMIM are struggling to come to a settlement over the seat sharing. With the BJP saying Ambedkar is a CM candidate material, he has succeeded in driving a wedge between the VBA and the Congress and thus putting the chances of an understanding between them in jeopardy.

For the BJP-Sena combine, this coming election should be a cake-walk unless there is a last minute understanding among the three opposition parties viz the Congress, NCP and VBA keeping their individual interests aside and fighting as a united front to give a semblance of resistance to the formidable saffron alliance. The NDA is riding high with the just concluded Parliamentary elections where they literally decimated the once strong rivals Congress-NCP combine in Maharashtra.

A later Marian visionary began a religious order devoted to the Marian title called The Order of the Slaves of the Immaculate child.

Pope Benedict XV recognised the Marian image in Senglea , Malta under the title of Mariee Bambina honouring Mary's nativity and granting her canonised coronation on 1 May 1920 which was crowned by Archbishop Caurauna on 4 September 1921 -this Marian image once adorned a Catholic galleon shipwrecked in 1618 near the Dalmation islands and rescued

and given to the present town for celebrations of the feast on 8 September.

In the Philippines pious Catholics adopted devotion to Mary and dressed her in pastel colours and crowned her with flowers to emphasise her virginity and innocence under traditional diadem / customs used for adult saint images and later Hispanic traditions of candles and cakes are popularly offered in Mary's honour emphasising honour to La Dulcie Maria or the servant Mary

On 27 December 2018 the Philippines House of Representatives officially a bill 7856 in honour of Mary's birthday on 8 September declaring that Mary's birthday as a partial holiday.

In Austria the nativity of our lady is celebrated as Doan Day with a caravan full of animals decorations various types of food as a tradition.

In art Medieval depictions of the nativity of our lady include birth by St Anne which in later medieval settings is in a wealthy household.

Thus we see how the different and varied worldwide celebrations of the nativity of our lady emphasise her nativity celebrations making it a joyous and holy celebration which forever continued to be remembered by and in the best possible spirit since a festival is an expression of joy and also one of peace.

this year, raising massive sums of money from marquee investors such as the Chan Zuckerberg initiative and looking to expand internationally. And Byju's seems to have cracked the edtech model, the company says it's on track to make Rs. 400 crore in sales this year. Founder Byju Raveendran is now himself worth a cool Rs. 1,000 crore.

## Bhavin and Divyank Turakhia

The Turakhia brothers were ranked 98th on India's rich list with a net worth of \$1.55 billion (Rs 7150 crore). The duo is famously known for bootstrapped ad-tech startup Media.net,



St. Luke informs us that Zachariah ended his canticle by reaching out to the mercy of God, "Guiding our feet into the way of peace." (Lk.1:79).

To gain peace of mind you should begin by having a sincere desire to love God, to declare your deep dependence on God. The letter St. Paul wrote to the Romans said: "We know that in everything, God works for the good of those who love him, whom he has called according to his plan". There are six points for reaching peace of mind.

First: Keep the mind occupied. Actively work towards a goal. Follow a dream even when the effort you make is not appreciated by others. Let your dream become a dynamic vision and peace of mind will catch up with you. Decide on what makes you happy;

be it cooking, carpentry, collecting world postage stamps, photography or having a sense of achievement in religious works. A vacant mind tempts the devil to step in.

Second: Change your attitude to fit your environment. On reflection, you should calm any disturbing event with kindness. Never undermine a person. Reach out to people as a friend would, or an advisor or a spiritual guide. Try to be humble even in the case of

a no-win situation. Do not be proud, as you know, pride will have a fall. Try not to embitter people. Fellowship is always welcome by any count. Even the diehard will melt if you give him a genuine hug.

Third: Avoid interfering in other peoples' arguments. Remember to keep your opinions to yourself, sometimes; because your way is not always the way others think, feel or make decisions. You will find peace of mind by avoiding human frailties in other people, try to understand human nature and help whenever you can as a blessed privilege. A little compassion with affection can work wonders. What matters would be to earn the respect of friends and neighbors to gain peace of mind.

Fourth: Do not over indulge in whatever you do. Keep a limit to carrying out responsibilities. When people try to maximize their work load they satisfy their ego, creating physical and health issues. Try to cut down on external plans and find the time to meditate, pray and make self-appraisal. Peace of mind is possible if you are not in a restless state of mind. Someone once said, an uncluttered mind is the showcase for peace.



Not all vegetables are alike, which means there's no single best way to store them all. Fresh greens like lettuce can't be handled the same way as root vegetables like potatoes or carrots. Additionally, certain practic-

es, like peeling or washing, can lengthen or shorten their life, depending on various factors. Storing certain vegetables together can also affect how long they last. Here's everything you need to know to store your vegetables for maximum freshness.

#### Cool, dry, dark place:

Some veggies stay fresh longest in a cool or room-temperature location, away from moisture, heat and light. In some cases this might be a kitchen cupboard (not situated directly next to your oven) or it might mean a dedicated pantry. The ideal temperature for your pantry is be-

tween 10 and 21 degree Celsius, Veggies to store in your pantry include:

- Onions
- Shallots
- Garlic
- Hard squash like winter, acorn, spaghetti and butternut
- All types of potatoes (including yams and sweet potatoes)

 Asparagus has a fairly short shelflife, even when refrigerated. You'll know when your asparagus is starting to go when the tips of the stalks start to look dry and withered. Asparagus will keep for 2 to 3 days in the crisper.

- Eggplant, celery, peppers, peas, artichokes, zucchini and cucumber will last up to a week in the fridge.
- Summer squash, yellow squash and green beans 3 to 5 days.
- Brussels sprouts will last between 3 to 5 days.
- · Cauliflower will last 1 week.
- Carrots, parships, turnips, beets and radishes can be stored in a plastic produce bag and will last 2 weeks.
- The same goes for lettuce and other leafy greens, which will last from 3 days up to a week depending on how delicate the leaves are.
- Mushrooms will last 3 to 5 days and should be refrigerated in a paper bag.
- Ears of corn should be stored in their husks; they will last between 1 to 2 days.

#### On the counter:

While there are myriad fruits, such as stone fruits, citrus and bananas that should be stored on the countertop, the only vegetable you should keep there are tomatoes. In any case, keep your tomatoes on the countertop, out of direct sunlight. The fridge will turn their texture grainy.

High Ethylene Producers: Keep away from other fresh produce to slow down ripening/spoilage.

#### Storing tall stalks:

We're thinking asparagus and green onions in particular. A quart-sized glass jar is perfect here. With asparagus, remove the rubber bands, trim an inch off the bottoms and stand them up in a glass jar. Don't crowd them, though. You might have to split a bunch across two jars. Fill halfway with water, then cover the stalks with a plastic produce bag and secure with a rubber band.

Asparagus will stay fresh this way for at least a week. You can use this technique with green onions as well, only don't trim the bottoms.
